ASHLEE

ASHLEE

Seriously? Why do you constantly dismiss my intuition.

DR. HUNT

I'm not dismissing anything you've said.

ASHLEE

Have you ever cheated on your wife?

DR. HUNT

I'm getting paid to listen to you. It doesn't work the other way around.

ASHLEE

How do you expect me to open up to you when you aren't honest with me. I need to trust you.

DR. HUNT

That's fair. I will give you one answer and no others. This isn't about me. This is about you.

ASHLEE

I'm not asking for your pin number. It's a simple question. Have, you, ever cheated on your wife?

DR. HUNT

No, I haven't and I never would. I take my marriage vows as serious as I take my career in medicine.

There is a brief silence.

ASHLEE

I believe you. I also believe that sometimes when I'm in your office I can see you undressing me with your eyes.

Dr. Hunt takes a minute to respond. DR. HUNT I believe that you are confused about the nature of our sessions. I don't-

ASHLEE

You don't what?

DR. HUNT
